 - Approved on second reading Ordinance 19-942, an ordinance to amend the City of Goodlettsville Municipal Code Title 9, Chapter 2 by deleting Chapter 2 in its entirety and replacing it with a new Chapter 2, as it relates to Peddlers.
 - Approved on second reading Ordinance 19-943, an ordinance to amend the City of Goodlettsville Municipal Code Title 7, Chapter 3 by deleting Chapter 3 in its entirety and replacing it with a new Chapter 3, as it relates to Fire Services.
 - Approved on first reading Ordinance 19-944, an ordinance to amend the City of Goodlettsville Municipal Code Title 3, Chapter 4 by deleting Section 402 in its entirety as it relates to Electronic Citation Regulations and Fines.
 - Approved on first reading Ordinance 19-945, an ordinance to amend the City of Goodlettsville Municipal Code Title 15, by creating a new Chapter 9, as it relates to shareable dockless mobility devices.

Chief Goodwin's Monthly Report

July 2019

July 4th the department provided for the safety and security of those attending the City's July 4th Celebration at Moss-Wright Park. July 10th Chief Goodwin attended the Beer Board meeting. July 17th Chief Goodwin attended the Drug Task Force meeting. July 18th Chief Goodwin was present at Music on Main, Cmdr. Cherry provided safety information to Kinder-Care and to a women's group at Cottage Grove. Cmdr. Cherry spoke to children attending VBS at Connection Pointe Church on July 24th. July 24th through July 26th Chief Goodwin attended the TACP Conference in Chattanooga. Cmdr. DeLoach provided active killer training to Goodlettsville Smiles on 7/29.

The Pharmaceutical Bin provided by the State of Tennessee Department of Environment & Conservation was in the lobby during the month of July and 94.4 pounds of unwanted pharmaceuticals were deposited. Since its use 2487.14 pounds of unwanted pharmaceuticals have been deposited.

In review of the TIBRS data comparing July 2019 to July 2018 Crime Against Person decreased from 22 to 10 a 45% decrease, and Crime Against Property increased from 66 to 68 incidents a 2.95% increase and overall we had a decrease of 88 to 78 incidents. Our UCR total for the month was a 14.90% decrease from 47 to 40 incidents.

Our proactive efforts were good for the month of July. Our officers made 1007 Traffic Stops and 8 Terry Stops. They made 119 Traffic Arrests and 10 DUI Arrests. From these Traffic Stops resulted 13 Felony charges, 147 Misdemeanor charges, and 24 warrants were served. They had 17 drug confiscations (9 from traffic stops). They issued 15 Misdemeanor Citations, made 60 Physical Arrests with 49 Misdemeanor charges and 11 Felony charges. They made 1 Juvenile Felony Arrest and 11 Juvenile Misdemeanor Arrests.

The other part of the strategy involves serving outstanding warrants. Persons with outstanding warrants have already proven a proclivity for involvement in criminal activity. By arresting them for their outstanding warrants we prevent their opportunities for committing crime. During the month they made 25 Warrant Service Attempts. They served 9 Felony Warrants and 40 Misdemeanor Warrants.

Our officers continue to check our apartments, neighborhoods, businesses and parks. They conducted 354 apartment checks, 421 checks of neighborhoods, 1038 business checks and 305 park checks. They had 172 Community Contacts. They issued 632 Park Smarts.

JULY REPORT

This monthly forum will keep you informed of ongoing and upcoming projects and provide updated information on where we are with projects as they progress from the planning phase into design and become reality. Here is a sampling of what we currently are working on to enhance our town's livability.

Peay Park Splash Pad

This six hundred thousand dollar project is 50 percent grant and will extend over the next two years. It will add a water feature at the location of the old baseball field in Peay Park. This will be the first phase in the revitalization of the City's oldest park. **Status: The site preparation and building renovations are being self-performed by the city. Construction is underway with the expected opening of the project in September of 2019.**

Main Street Enhancements

This 12 million dollar project is 80 percent grant and will extend over the next two and one half years. Its purpose is to change the look and feel of the heart of Goodlettsville and to meet the ADA requirements of TDOT. The aim of this project is to allow the center section of town a more walkable and inviting place to shop and mingle for all. **Status: Negotiations for easements are underway. Utility relocation design coordination is in progress. Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2020 with completion by the end of 2022.**

Sidewalks Additions

In conjunction with the Main Street project the city is preparing a series of projects to enhance walkability throughout Goodlettsville. Budgets are being set to add sidewalks along certain sections of the main thoroughfares in the city such as Loretta Drive, Caldwell Drive, Rivergate Parkway, North Creek Circle and Windsor Green Boulevard. These projects will seek to link residential areas with commercial and recreational areas and provide connectivity for some of the disconnected commercial developments within the city. **Status: The TDOT Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) grant for a sidewalk connecting Moss Wright Park to North Creek Park along Caldwell Road and Long Hollow Pike has been funded. Application for environmental clearance is underway. Design will begin in the first quarter of 2020 with construction scheduled for 2021. A new grant application for a sidewalk around the city hall property has been submitted. Budgeting and preliminary design are ongoing on other projects as well. ADA accessibility deficiencies have been identified and a corrective action plan has been prepared and is awaiting approval.**

Conference Drive Improvements

The Conference Drive corridor is the southern entrance to our city. The need for this road to look and feel inviting is imperative to bringing visitors and businesses into Goodlettsville. The preliminary design documents of this half million dollar, 80 percent grant project are complete and are awaiting the start of phase two of the signalization upgrades to finish. **Status: Final design of the project is complete. The city is awaiting funding for construction to be released by TDOT. Construction is expected to begin in fall of 2019 with completion by the end of 2020.**

Signalization Upgrades

Phase One of the signal coordination is complete and got things started to help traffic move smoother on Long Hollow Pike and Conference Drive. Phase two will provide upgrades to coordinate and improve traffic flow on Conference Drive, Long Hollow Pike and Main Street. This 2 million dollar, 100 percent grant will provide state of the art signal control for the City. **Status: Final design of the project is complete. The city is awaiting funding for construction to be released by TDOT. Construction inspection services have been solicited. Construction is expected to begin in the fall of 2019 with completion by the end of 2020.**

Drainage Improvements

With the implementation of the storm water utility in 2013, the city is now able to address some of the drainage system problems that currently exist in Goodlettsville. Area drainage issues are being identified and earmarked for projects as funds become available. These projects such as the Gateway neighborhood and Hollywood Street will improve flow to better distribute runoff in heavy rainfall for the purpose of flood prevention. **Status: Design on the second phase of the Gateway Neighborhood drainage improvements is complete and ready for bid. A feasibility study for storm water control in the area of city hall and negotiations is scheduled to begin in the fall of 2019. Two other culvert replacement projects on Bluebird Drive and Wren Road are designed and awaiting bids. Construction for the replacement culverts is scheduled for completion in the summer of 2020.**

Bank Stabilization Moss Wright Park

The bank along Mansker Creek at Moss Wright Park is being eroded by changes in stream flow. A grant study is underway for long term remediation. **Status: A new phase of bank stabilization has been funded and is awaiting construction in the fall of 2019.**
