Chief Goodwin's Monthly Report

February 2020

Commander DeLoach provided workplace violence training to employees at the Visitor's Center on February 6th. Chief Goodwin attended the TACP meetings on February 6th & 7th. Chief Goodwin and Commander Cherry attended the Burton Heights Neighborhood Watch meeting on February 17th. Commander DeLoach did a workplace violence presentation to employees of Descase and Commander Cherry spoke to children at FLOE Academy on February 18th. Chief Goodwin attended the DTF meeting on February 19th. Commander DeLoach, Commander Cherry, Sgt. Preston and Chief Goodwin did new applicant testing on February 22nd. Chief Goodwin attended the Dollar General presentation at Goodlettsville Middle School on February 24th. Commander DeLoach met with persons from Calvary Chapel Church about safety and security issues on February 25th. Chief Goodwin attended the Chamber luncheon on February 27th.

The Pharmaceutical Bin provided by the State of Tennessee Department of Environment & Conservation was in the lobby during the month of February and 69.8 pounds of unwanted pharmaceuticals were deposited. Since its use 2896.36 pounds of unwanted pharmaceuticals have been deposited.

In review of the TIBRS data comparing February 2020 to February 2019 Crime Against Person decreased from 17 to 15 incidents a 11.77% decrease, and Crime Against Property increased from 51 to 52 incidents a 1.93% increase and overall we had a decrease of 68 to 67 incidents. Our UCR total for the month was an 4.45% decrease from 45 to 43 incidents.

Our proactive efforts were good for the month of February. Our officers made 927 Traffic Stops and 2 Terry Stops. They made 105 Traffic Arrests and 16 DUI Arrests. From these Traffic Stops resulted 10 Felony charges, 150 Misdemeanor charges, and 14 warrants were served. They had 23 drug confiscations (17 from traffic stops). They issued 14 Misdemeanor Citations, made 53 Physical Arrests with 52 Misdemeanor charges and 12 Felony charges. They made 2 Juvenile Misdemeanor Arrests and 1 Loitering.

The other part of the strategy involves serving outstanding warrants. Persons with outstanding warrants have already proven a proclivity for involvement in criminal activity. By arresting them for their outstanding warrants we prevent their opportunities for committing crime. During the month they made 29 Warrant Service Attempts. They served 17 Felony Warrants and 33 Misdemeanor Warrants.

Our officers continue to check our apartments, neighborhoods, businesses and parks. They conducted 255 apartment checks, 352 checks of neighborhoods, 1061 business checks and 257 park checks. They had 134 Community Contacts. They issued 469 Park Smarts.


YTD TIBRS - 2020 VS 2019

FEBRUARY REPORT

This monthly forum will keep you informed of ongoing and upcoming projects and provide updated information on where we are with projects as they progress from the planning phase into design and become reality. Here is a sampling of what we currently are working on to enhance our town's livability.

Main Street Enhancements

This 12 million dollar project is 80 percent grant and will extend over the next two and one half years. Its purpose is to change the look and feel of the heart of Goodlettsville and to meet the ADA requirements of TDOT. The aim of this project is to allow the center section of town a more walkable and inviting place to shop and mingle for all. **Status: Negotiations for easements are progressing. Utility relocation design coordination is underway. Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2022 with completion by the end of 2024.**

Sidewalks Additions

In conjunction with the Main Street project the city is preparing a series of projects to enhance walkability throughout Goodlettsville. Budgets are being set to add sidewalks along certain sections of the main thoroughfares in the city such as Loretta Drive, Caldwell Drive, Rivergate Parkway, North Creek Circle and Windsor Green Boulevard. These projects will seek to link residential areas with commercial and recreational areas and provide connectivity for some of the disconnected commercial developments within the city. **Status: The TDOT Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) grant for a sidewalk connecting Moss Wright Park to North Creek Park along Caldwell Road and Long Hollow Pike has been funded. Application for environmental clearance is underway. Design will begin in the first quarter of 2020 with construction scheduled to begin in 2021. Budgeting and preliminary design are ongoing on other projects as well. ADA accessibility deficiencies have been identified and a corrective action plan has been prepared for execution.**

Conference Drive Improvements

The Conference Drive corridor is the southern entrance to our city. The need for this road to look and feel inviting is imperative to bringing visitors and businesses into Goodlettsville. The preliminary design documents of this half million dollar, 80 percent grant project are complete and are awaiting the start of phase two of the signalization upgrades to finish. **Status: Final design of the project is complete. The city is awaiting Notice to Proceed to Construction from TDOT. Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2020 with completion by the end of 2021.**

Signalization Upgrades

Phase One of the signal coordination is complete and got things started to help traffic move smoother on Long Hollow Pike and Conference Drive. Phase two will provide upgrades to coordinate and improve traffic flow on Conference Drive, Long Hollow Pike and Main Street. This 2 million dollar, 100 percent grant will provide state of the art signal control for the City. The City is in the process of applying for a third phase of 100 percent grant money to provide centralized monitoring of the signals for specialized control during unusual traffic flow. **Status: Final design of the project is complete. The city received bids for construction and is awaiting approval from TDOT. Construction inspection services have been awarded. Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2020 with completion by the end of 2021.**

Drainage Improvements

With the implementation of the storm water utility in 2013, the city is now able to address some of the drainage system problems that currently exist in Goodlettsville. Area drainage issues are being identified and earmarked for projects as funds become available. These projects such as the Gateway neighborhood and Hollywood Street will improve flow to better distribute runoff in heavy rainfall for the purpose of flood prevention. **Status: Design on the second phase of the Gateway Neighborhood drainage improvements has been awarded. A feasibility study for storm water control in the area of city hall was deferred to the fall of 2020. Two other culvert projects on Bluebird Drive and Wren Road have been awarded. Construction for the replacement culvert at Bluebird Drive is scheduled for completion in the summer of 2020.**

Bank Stabilization Moss Wright Park

The bank along Mansker Creek at Moss Wright Park is being eroded by changes in stream flow. A grant study is underway for long term remediation. **Status: A new phase of bank stabilization has been funded and is awaiting construction in the by the end of 2020.**
