ORDINANCE NO. 20-969

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 17-887, AS IT RELATES TO THOSE SERVING AS THE DESIGNATED PUBLIC RECORDS REQUEST COORDINATORS FOR THE CITY OF GOODLETTSVILLE.

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Code Annotated 10-7-503 establishes requirements for access to public records each government entity in the State of Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the City of Goodlettsville has established procedures for public records by Ordinance 13-804 and sub-sequent Ordinance 17-887; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 17-887 established the designated Public Records Request Coordinators for the City of Goodlettsville; and

WHEREAS, certain changes are needed to the Public Records Request Coordinators representatives.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF GOODLETTSVILLE, TENNESSEE THAT ORDINANCE 17-887 IS AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE MEMBERS OF THE UNITED STATES SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE STATE OF TENNESSEE TO ASSIST IN THE CREATION AND FUNDING OF THE INDEPENDENT RESTAURANT STABILIZATION FUND.

WHEREAS, the COVID -19 Pandemic has created great financial hardships for businesses of all types; and,

WHEREAS, independently owned small businesses will face a harder financial recovery caused by the impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic; and,

WHEREAS, independent restaurants compose a large percentage of the businesses negatively impacted; and,

WHEREAS, there is currently efforts underway to formulate the Independent Restaurant Stabilization Fund in order to support those independent restaurants nationwide.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF GOODLETTSVILLE, TENNESSEE:

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE MEMBERS OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES NOT TO SUPPORT ANY REDUCTIONS OF STATE SHARED REVENUES OR ANY OTHER REVENUE PROVIDED TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS AS A PART OF ANY BUDGET AMENDMENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE STATE OF TENNESSEE FISCAL YEAR 2020-2021 BUDGET.

WHEREAS, the onset of the COVID-19 Pandemic in the State of Tennessee has created significant financial deficiencies in the generation all tax revenues; and

WHEREAS, the collection of said taxes are inclusive of State, County and Municipal Government entities; and

WHEREAS, as the need to make certain budget amendments may become necessary at all levels of government; and

WHEREAS, the City of Goodlettsville receives certain funds from the State of Tennessee if reduced would have a significant impact on the delivery of services to its residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF GOODLETTSVILLE THAT:

SECTION 1. It officially requests that members of the State of Tennessee Senate and House of Representatives not to support any reductions of state shared revenues or any other revenues provided to local governments as a part of any budget amendments associated with the State of Tennessee Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Budget.

SECTION 2. This resolution takes effect from and after its passage, the welfare of the City of Goodlettsville requiring it.

RESOLUTION NO. 20-921

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF GOODLETTSVILLE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ADOPTING THE 2020 DAVIDSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE MULTI-HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN.

WHEREAS, the County Mayor’s Office of Emergency Management has completed an update of the Metropolitan Nashville / Davidson County Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan, and it was submitted to the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Tennessee Emergency Management Agency for consideration and approval; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Goodlettsville has participated in the 2020 plan update process, and is committed to the Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan concept by adoption of the earlier plans; and,

WHEREAS, this plan has been distributed to jurisdictions, agencies and county municipalities for local adoption completion, and Federal emergency funding and grants are conditioned upon adoption of updated plan; and,

WHEREAS, upon submittal of adoption documentation by participating jurisdictions, the Federal Emergency Management Agency will issue formal approval of the 2020 Davidson County Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan to the County of Davidson; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF GOODLETTSVILLE, TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1: That the City of Goodlettsville hereby will recognize this plan as the principal Multi-Hazard Mitigation plan for the County of Davidson, and it shall be mandatory for the County of Davidson, its municipalities, and political subdivisions in accordance with the Tennessee Code Annotated and the Civil Defense Act of 1950 as amended, to adopt the updated Hazard Mitigation Plan upon.
